Week Four
Mercy Does
Not Judge

"Stop judging, that you may not be judged. For as you judge, so will you be judged, and the measure with which you measure will be measured out to you." Matthew 7:1-2

Every time that we choose to judge someone, we are failing to be merciful. Someone may be wrong, they may even deserve to be judged, but mercy does not judge. We are called to be merciful for the Father is merciful to us, so too are we to be merciful to others.

Listen well: each of us is capable of doing the same thing as the man or woman who is in prison. We all have the capacity to sin and to do the same, to make mistakes in life. They are no worse than you or I". Pope Francis
