Helping churches with hosting the homeless:

Location: Varies

Dinner Preparation: 2-3 people help prepare and serve dinner for approximately 15-20 people. Dinners can be finished up at the churches, if needed. Provide bread, a vegetable/salad, a main entrée, and dessert. May also need to make simple dish for the kids. Serve around 6:00 PM. Dine with guests, clean the kitchen and dining area after all done.

Afternoon Host: Host arrives about 5 PM to help entertain children and visit with and support their parents. Families are encouraged to be the hosts. Stay until the overnight hosts arrive, typically at 8 PM

Overnight Hosts (one male, one female): 8PM to 7 AM. Volunteers ensure that the guests are comfortable; help with any problems during the night; sleep in private rooms; wake guests at about 6:00 AM (7:00 AM on Saturday) and join guests for breakfast, and clean up after they leave.

Children’s Discovery Center

At the Shelter, Residents are given a warm place to sleep, daily meals and access to shower and laundry facilities and counseling. The average age of homeless in the U.S. is nine years old, which makes the Children’s Development Center an essential part of the shelter. The program offers education, individualized care and a chance for kids to be kids in a safe, clean environment.

Volunteers open the Children’s Development Center. The requirements primarily include monitoring to ensure a safe environment for families. Volunteers should feel free to interact with families. The families are required to maintain the facility.
